CAREER GOALS

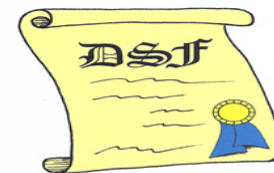
Jordan describes himself as an entrepreneur at heart and would like to own his own business.
